#### To my equestrian friends,

Cars of every age and description are displayed amongst the grand oaks that surround the building and display area. If you like hiking and the like, the **Red River Gorge** provides a plethora of trails and interesting sites. Kentucky is also known for its caves, a hour drive will get you to some of the most interesting formations in the country.

There are plenty of restaurants in the downtown area, including **Dudley's**, **Jonathan's at Gratz Park, Le Deauville, Table 310, Windy Corner, The Grey Goose and Nick Ryan's**, just to name a few. If you are looking for something a bit more quiet, Midway is a quaint town, reminiscent of a movie set, the town has shops and restaurants to suit most tastes.
